Brothers and Sisters of St. Michael's,

Lent has always held a very special place in my heart throughout my years growing up and especially as a Priest. Lent is meant to be a time of reflection for Christians around the world. But once again this year, it comes at a time of deep disquiet within the faith. Abuse and misconduct scandals have continued to rock the Catholic Church, leading many to question their religious institutions, or even their faith itself. It's supposed to be a time for serious renewal of your own spiritual priorities and life. We all get involved, every one of us. It doesn't make any difference from the pope to the peasant — your work, your family, your considerations, your local concerns, they consume you.

Lent is that season meant to take you away from that, to help you concentrate again on the choices you make and why you're making them. To make you reflect on who you want to be and if you are being it. To help you prepare for the biggest feast in the Christian year, which is Easter.

The purpose of Lent is not to deny ourselves for the sake of denial. It's not really meant to be a negative approach to life at all. It's meant to release us from the things that are weighing down the noise that's pressing in on us. Fasting simply reminds us that when we strip away the outer edges, we are freer to give more to the world.

At the end of the day, the faith is yours and mine. It's ours alone. Church can't give us the faith; it can teach us our faith, myself and my brother priests help teach our faith while Lent says, "How is your faith?" Lent is a time to strengthen it, put it where it ought to be: not in institutions but in the life of Jesus itself.

I ask for your prayers, I am curious about your choices made and your road taken...are you happy with your choices do you feel your soul and heart beat for your fellow man? Do you help those in need, can you forgive those in need of forgiveness...your prayers will get you to these places and with our Lord's guidance and understanding we will once again become love, happiness and understanding in our very large world today. Pray for peace.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK
2019 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one full meal is permitted, and two smaller meals, which, if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 10th, 2018 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 16th, 2019.

***Canon 920,1, All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.**

**-The Annunciation Of
The Lord-Feast Day
March 25th-**

The Annunciation of the Lord celebrates the angel Gabriel's appearance to the Virgin Mary, announcing that she had been chosen to be the Mother of Our Lord.

Although Nazareth was off the beaten track and a sleepy enough place, Mary's experience ranged far beyond the confines of the little village. There is a bustle about her going 'with haste' to visit her cousin Elizabeth in the hill country of Judah. She travelled to Bethlehem for the census and after that to Egypt. Every year, Joseph and Mary went up to Jerusalem. She went to Capernaum with Jesus and his disciples (Jn.2:12) and was back again in Jerusalem for the fateful days of the Passion (Jn.19:25-27). The last we hear of her in the New Testament, she is in the Upper Room with the apostles, some other women and the brothers of Jesus united in prayer (Acts 1.14)

Mary had the ability to take swift and decisive action. She went 'with haste' to visit Elizabeth. To some extent she joined her son in his ministry. She goes with the group to Capernaum and Jerusalem. The Gospel of Luke notes the thoughtful, reflective aspect of Mary. On two occasions, he describes her mulling over the whole thing in her mind as she went about her life (Lk.2:19, 51). The Magnificat tells of her radical sense of justice and her ability to express trenchant social criticism (Lk.1:46-55).

It is not difficult to imagine her dressed in a tunic of undyed wool. Hands and fingers roughened from years of work in the fields. The whole village would help out in times of planting, weeding, gleaning, picking. Her face would be burnt brown, lined and worn by the sun and hard work.

Her face would have reflected many an emotion: tense with fear on the flight to Egypt, calm in repose, warm in love, cross with anxiety when they found the child in Jerusalem, her eyes bright as a button, alert, intelligent, flashing with humor or outrage.

As it does not appear many times throughout the books of the apostles in the New Testament, the Annunciation, itself, is not the "highlight" or "purpose" of the time Jesus spent on Earth. The Annunciation is, however, a time of celebration of the Virgin Mary conceiving the Savior, Jesus. It is a time of celebration for Christians around the world as a most blessed time of the year.

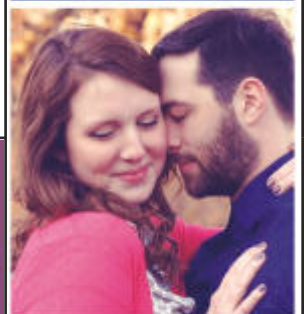
