We welcome all our regular parishioners and our guests to this awesome Sunday with the coming next week of Holy Week, our most significant week of celebrations of the life of our Lord, Jesus Christ. As we continue our Lenten journey there is no better time to heed the call of Jesus to "come away to a deserted place" than the Lenten season. All of us need these times of solitude to take stock of ourselves. The world in which we live is so hectic and busy that it generates precious little time for soul care. Jesus understood that He and the disciples were going about doing many great things and yet, going to a deserted place was a matter of necessity. Lent is the season of deserted places.

As we steer our lives in the other worldly path of self-denial, we automatically find that it is a less traveled road. Perhaps we can take advantage of that reality and spend some quality time with God. After all, practices of self-denial are designed to make us keenly aware of our need for God.

Lent is about what Christ gave the world – salvation. The observation of Lent is a way to place ourselves humbly before God as we confess our inadequacies, strip ourselves of pretense, and open our souls before God to receive His grace.

We are part of a continuous line of Christians who have celebrated for 2000 years the One who was born in poverty, lived sinlessly, died on a cross, and rose from the dead. Jesus secured us a place in the Kingdom of God – here and now, and eternally in heaven. He opened wide the doors of kingdom – living in today's world. He offers peace beyond our dreams, joy beyond our expressions, wisdom beyond our understanding and accomplishments beyond our abilities.

Lent gives us 40 days to prepare for a joyous Easter response to grace.

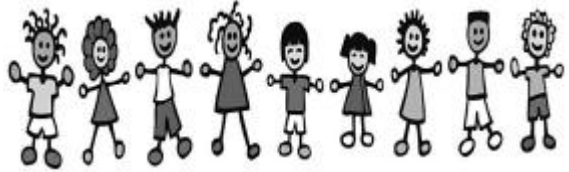

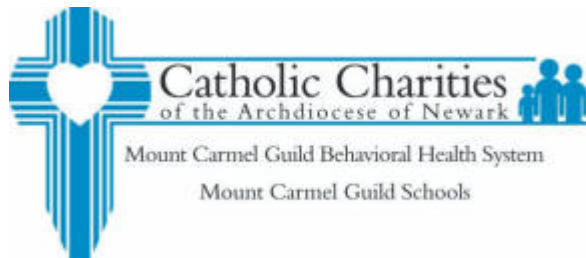

Easter Joy



The Easter season is upon us and the universal Church is rejoicing. Some people, however, have difficulty experiencing these joys due to their circumstances in life. Catholic Charities aims to help relieve the suffering of many in our society through its various programs. Each year, the *Sharing God's Blessings Annual Appeal* funds vital programs and ministries, such as the Catechetical Office of the Archdiocese of Newark. The ministry of catechesis is essential to the life of the Church. We are committed to passing on the faith to the next generation and the formation of missionary disciples, people driven by a relationship with Jesus to live the Gospel.

The Archdiocesan Catechetical Office does this every day by supporting 330 Parish Catechetical Leaders (Directors and Coordinators of Religious Education) in their efforts at their local parish. With a growing number of lay ecclesial leaders, some of whom are volunteers, the support, resources, and training that our office provides is crucial to the success of their efforts. The office also provides formation for over **7,000 catechists** through workshops offered throughout the Archdiocese, the annual Catechist Convocation, and various online opportunities. Together with parish leaders and catechists, we work to provide effective programs for **65,874 children and teens**, as well as for their parents and families. In addition, the office serves to support catechesis in 94 Catholic Schools of the Archdiocese and supports programs that serve nearly **30,000 adults** participating in adult faith formation opportunities.

Some of the initiatives that the Catechetical Office is able to provide are Family and Adult Faith Formation programs, Bible Conferences, and, most recently, support of Prison Ministry. Our goal is to help parish leaders in their ministry with families by providing training, materials, consultation, and support for program design and implementation. The Family and Adult Faith Formation program offers the *Spotlight* series, which are courses that focus on the Sacred Scriptures and the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The Bible Conference is a new initiative in collaboration with the Evangelization Office and the American Bible Society, which has enabled the Catechetical Office to offer an Archdiocesan Bible Conference, offering workshops, presentations, as well as bible literacy programs. In addition, we most recently began work on providing scripture resources, catechetical materials, and bibles to prisoners who are incarcerated in the prisons located in the archdiocese.

We are reminded that the Church "is bidden to offer catechesis her best resources in people an energy, without sparing effort, toil or material means, in order to organize it better and to train qualified personnel. This is no mere human calculation; it is an attitude of faith." (Catechesis Tradendae, 15)

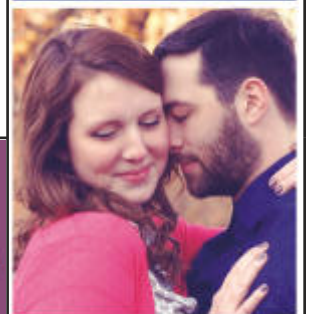
